Our International Language and Sports Camp Inzell, which is run in cooperation with the Bavarian Sports Association (Bayerischer Landessportbund, BLSV), lies within the majestic Alpine Foreland between the cities of Munich and Salzburg. It is arguably the perfect location for great free-time activities, and close enough for day trips to the Bavarian state capital Munich or the beautiful historc city of Salzburg in Austria.

You will stay in one of the camps many country-style log houses which accommodate 8 to 12 young participants. Each house is equipped with its own bathroom and shower as well as a common room. We see to it that the nationalities in each house are very diverse, so that you are able to speak German or English all the time and learn to master the challenges that the daily life on camp has in store for you. Nonetheless, when you arrive with a friend, we will allow the two of you to be accommodated in the same camp house.

Language course

- + Staff to student ratio 1:15 (1 supervisor for every 15 students)
- + 24/7 Emergency Hotline and care provided by the ASTUR team on camp around the clock

ASTUR - EDUCATION MADE IN GERMANY

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What awaits you in the International Sports and Language Camp in Inzell

Arrival and Accommodation

Arrivals and departures for the language and sports camp in Inzell are scheduled for Saturdays. Your parents will either bring you to the camp site by car, or you will travel by plane to Munich or Salzburg, or by train to Traunstein station. If you arrive or depart by plane, we recommend that you book our transfer service to/from Inzell at right when you make your camp reservation. Transfer service ensures that you will be picked up and taken to camp, so that you won't need to worry about anything. If you arrive by train in Traunstein, transfer service is included.

Please organise your arrival and departure at the airport so that you arrive before 12:00 noon and depart after 12:00 noon. For arrivals and transfers outside the allotted times we will have to add a surcharge.

If, due to your age, you have booked a UM service (UM = Unaccompanied Minor) with your airline, you also have to book our UM service accordingly – in addition to our general transfer service. This is necessary as handling unaccompanied minors at the airport is more complicated and time-consuming.



Residential accommodation on camp

At the BLSV camp Inzell, you will stay in an 8- to 12-bed blockhouse with other international students. Showers and toilets are located in each house.

As we offer full board to our students, you will begin the day with a good breakfast in the morning. You can choose what you would like to eat from a buffet. After the morning programme every student will have a lunch break before the afternoon activities. There will always be a hot meal for lunch and dinner and we invite you to fill your plate with food from the buffet.

And, of course, we are not ignorant to special diets. Please let us know in your application whether you are a vegetarian, a vegan or have any other dietary requirement. We will do our best to accommodate your preferences and cater for your individual needs.

Language Course

Your intensive language course will always consist of 3 lessons a day on 5 days per week. At the beginning of every week, each student will take a language placement test, which will give your teacher insight in the level of your language proficiency. Even though we will cluster the groups according to the students' language skill when possible, sometimes, depending on the booking situation, different levels will be taught in the same class together. However, as such a situation is rather common at many schools around the world, we know how to handle and react to classes of various language skill levels. Our teachers are experienced in preparing the best lesson material, appropriate to each individual student. We also always comply to a maximum limit of 15 students per class, so that lessons are manageable and give you the opportunity to actively participate in class a lot more than you can at your school at home.

Learning to use the language actively is the main aim of the lessons. Our teachers create their own motivating, cultural and original lesson plans. They can be about a whole range of topics that are taken from "real life" in the form of discussions, role plays, interviews and other active elements. You are encouraged to just talk and not be afraid of your mistakes. Seize the opportunity as speaking the language freely will boost your learning success and motivate you to continue mastering the language in the future. Your vocabulary and knowledge of grammar will also automatically expand and improve – not through ineffective memorising, but rather through speaking and listening.

Our teachers are native speakers. That means that they do not only speak the language fluently, but they have an ingrained understanding of their native culture. They also have experience in imparting their language to students from foreign countries.

We teach from levels A1 (beginner with previous knowledge) up to B2 (Upper Intermediate) in accordance with the CEFR (Common European Framework of Reference for Languages). We have different lesson material for every level, and the certificate that you receive at the end of your stay will indicate at what level and for how many hours you were taught.

Please note that, on camp, all methods of teaching, lesson structures and content follow the same ASTUR standards, no matter which language is being taught.

Free Time and Supervision

It is our policy to always offer a range of activities and programmes to our students. Every afternoon you will have a varied programme of activities. Together with all the other international students, you will have fun exploring the nature with outdoor action or participating in sports activities.



Naturally, there are evening activities after dinner; such as dances and parties for example. Just like the afternoon activities, you will have the opportunity to practise your foreign languages here, as you get to know the students from other countries.

The highlight of the week, and a lovely finale for everyone before they go home, is the day trip. You will go to interesting places, such as to Munich, where you will have a tour of the town to see the most important sights, or will visit the exciting BMW World or the stadium of FC Bayern Munich, its training facilities and museum.

The weekly half-day trip leads to Salzburg in Austria, the city where famous composer Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart was born.

The free-time programme is organised and led by our English and German speaking supervisors. There will always be a ratio of fifteen students per supervisor. Our supervisors will know 'their' students, just as you will get to know 'your' supervisor. They are always there for you to talk to, whether you feel unwell, have a question, or just simply want to have a chat.

Furthermore, we have a 24-hour emergency hotline every day and we will react to your calls immediately should there be a bigger problem.

Good to know

Before the beginning of your stay you will receive a detailed information pack from us about the camp, everything you need to know about arrival, what you should pack and the activity programme.

As soon as you check in at the camp, you will receive your ID card with all the important contact numbers, so that you can reach your supervisors by telephone if you need to.

Please note, that your regular health insurance is most likely to not cover all treatment costs incurred in Germany. We, therefore, generally recommend purchasing foreign health insurance as well as accident and liability insurance. You can purchase these insurances without hassle through us as a complete pack for the duration of your stay.

If you do not book your insurance through ASTUR, we will need to see proof of your existing insurance before your arrival.

If you need a visa to enter Germany you will be required to show proof that you have purchased a respective insurance in order to apply for the visa. It's best to talk to your agency or with us directly. We're always happy to help.
